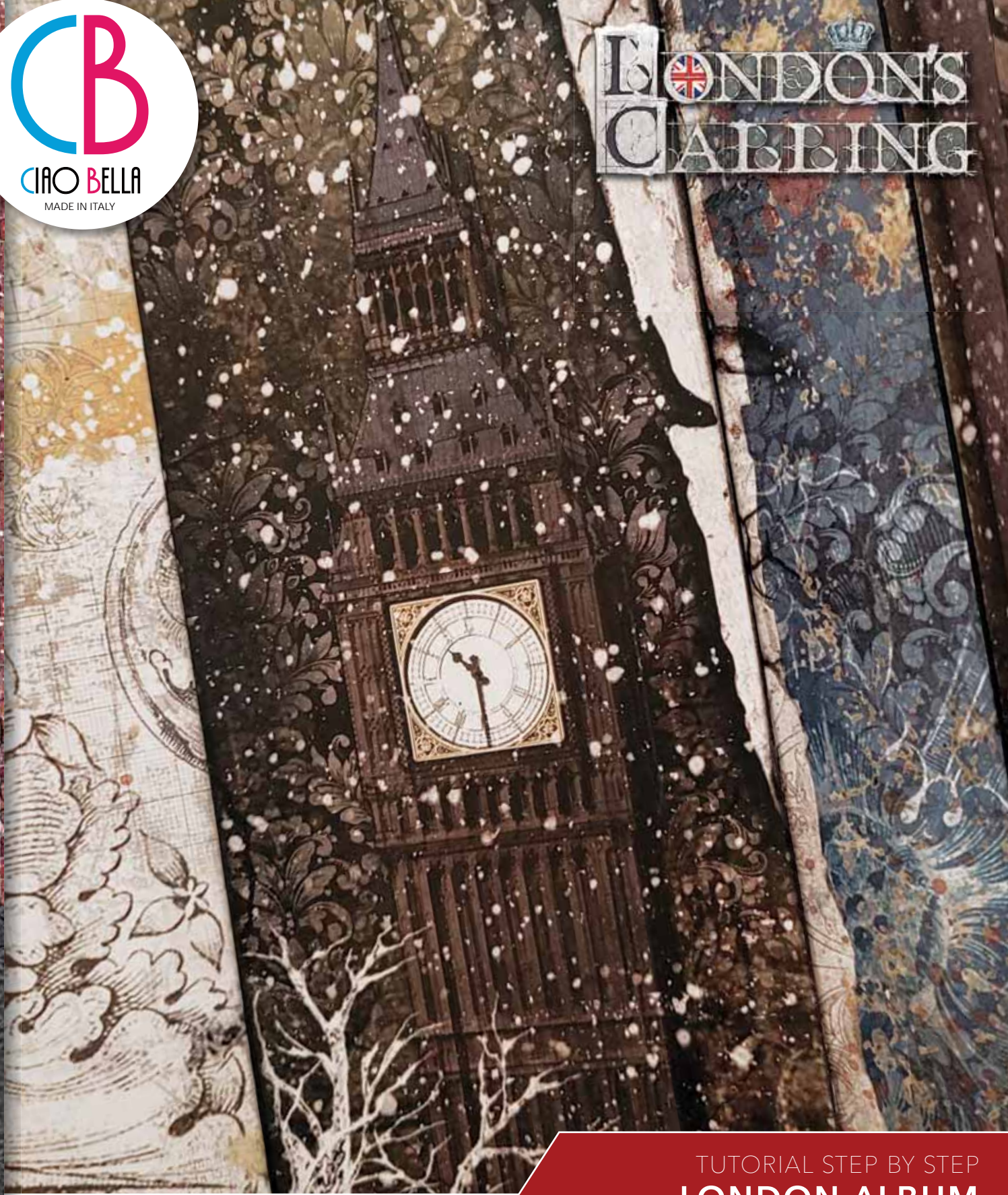

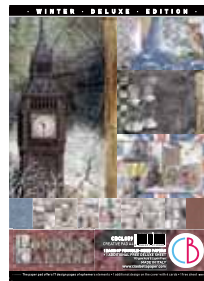

# LONDON ALBUM

## MATERIALS

- Paper Pad + Patterns Pad 30x30 London + 15x15 fussy cut pad
- Cardboard 2 mm A3 size
- Black cardboard, 7 papers 35x25 cm
- 1 metal lock for box
- 4 little hinges for box
- Texture stencil 8'x8' "The London Gazette"
- Texture paste, color by choosing
- Glue for paper and cardboard

1

Cut two cardboard rectangles 15x20 cm (2 mm thickness) and 2 stripes of scrapbooking paper 20x4 cm: do the central binding of the stripes and stick the two rectangles together using them, creating a 90° angle.



- 2 Wrap the outer cardboard base using the scrapbooking paper chosen from the different pattern of the collection "London's calling".

Cut two cardboard rectangles 20x10.5 and wrap the outer part with the scrapbooking paper.

Place the two hinges for box on the sides of the cover: two for each side and two for each front part of the cover. Position the lock of the cover. After having placed all the metal elements, glue the scrapbooking paper in the inner part of the cover.

Decorate the cover with the texture paste and the stencils 8'x8' The London Gazette.

The pages of the album are positioned on each side.

Prepare the bases with the black cardboard. Create 8 pages for each side: you'll need one cardboard to create two pages, so you'll use 4 cardboards for the right sides and 4 cardboards for the left sides.

In order to make the album more caching, the pages sizes won't be regular: while the height will stay 19.5 cm, the width can change by choosing, but remember that the larger pages can't exceed 16.5 cm and the narrower ones should measure about 11.5 cm.

Each couple of pages will be stuck one inside the other.

Here an example of measures:

16.5 cm – binding – 4.5 cm – binding– 12 cm  
(outer pages)

12 cm – binding – 3.0 cm – binding – 12 cm  
(second couple)

10 cm – binding – 1.5 cm – binding – 10 cm  
(third couple)

8 cm – binding – 0.5 cm – binding – 8 cm (fourth couple)\*

\*Those are the suggested measure, but you can follow the pattern of the paper.

In this case the first pages are more regular, following the shapes of the boxes. Remember to precisely calculate the inner space for the binding.

Glue together the pages, as in picture.

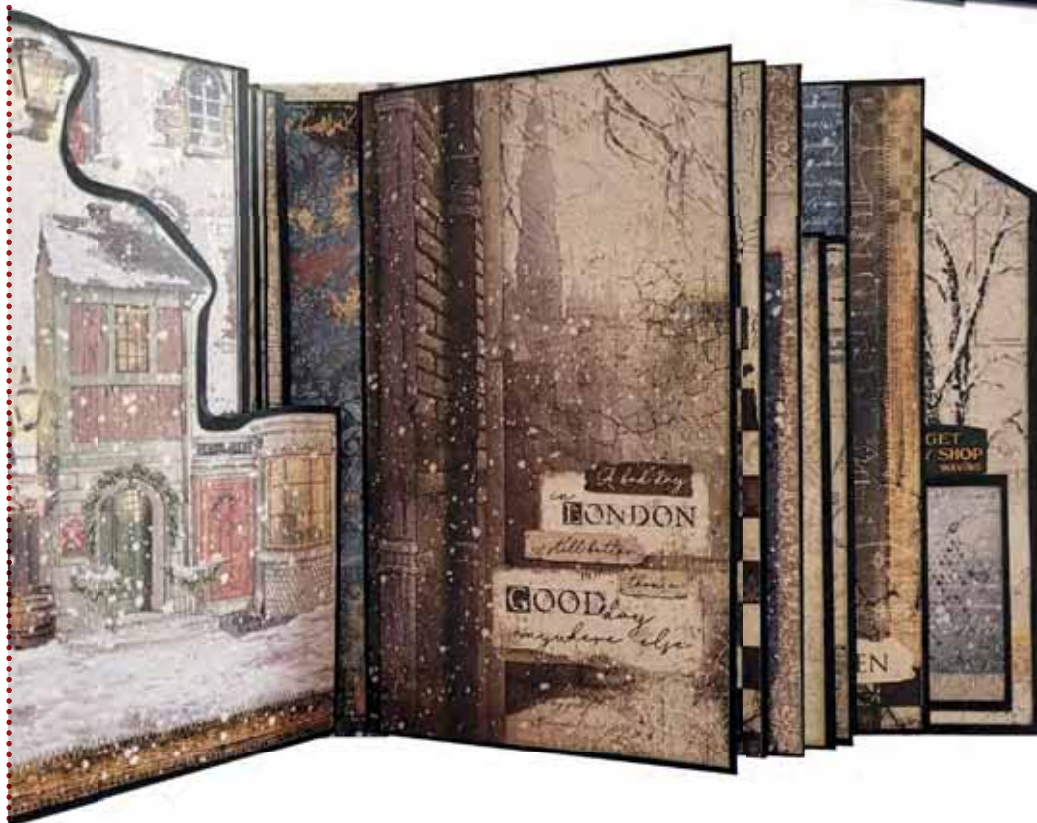
Prepare the bases for the picture. Black cardboard 9x9 cm and 9x7 cm; scrapbooking paper 8.5x8.5 cm and 8.5x6.5cm on them. Stick them by choosing and decorate with elements from the fussy cut pad.

Glue the pages in the base of the album. Leave 0.8 cm from the left edge and 1.2 cm from the right edge. The pages are positioned in the album following the left-right-left-right scheme (opening and closing in the same way).

In the central part of the album, you can create a little shadowbox or another type of composition, in this case, for example, there is a landscape created using scrapbooking paper and cardboard: choose the view you like the most and cut a stripe of about 7x19.5 cm. Cut the cardboard 10x19.5 cm, stick the scrapbooking paper in the central part, do the binding on both the right and left sides, where the glue will be placed, and stick this element in the middle of the album.
